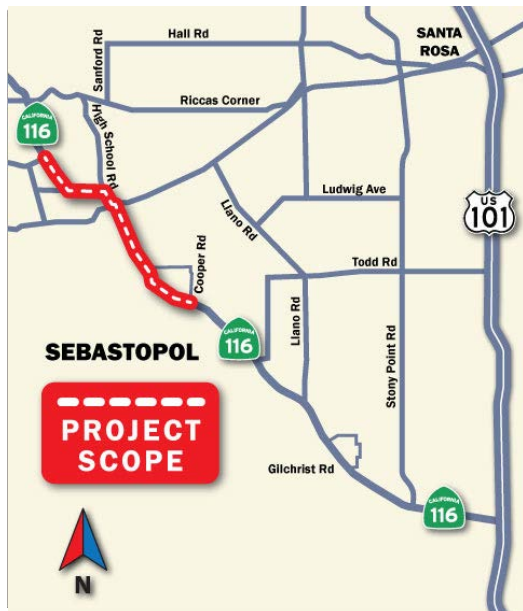

State Route 116 Sebastopol SB 1 Funded Pavement Repair Work Starts Monday, July 30, 2018 Watch for Reduced Traffic Lanes Expect Delays

SONOMA COUNTY – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has scheduled a Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) funded pavement repair project on State Route 116 (SR-116) between Mill Station Road and Cooper Road in the City of Sebastopol.

The \$3.0 million project is a SB 1 funded project which will enhance safety for motorists and provide a smoother drive. SB 1 is also known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.



Paving prep work will require adjusting utility vaults and manholes starting, Monday July 30 until the week of Monday, August 6.

Pavement work tentatively starts Monday, August 6. During the daytime prep work, starting July 30 and concluding the week of August 6, reduced traffic lanes will be in effect on various sections of SR-116 in Sebastopol. Motorists should watch for flaggers and expect delays. All work is weather permitting.

During the overnight paving work, starting Monday, August 6 and concluding the end of September 2018, one of two traffic lanes in each direction of SR-116 may be closed overnight with at least one traffic lane in each direction remaining open.

The nighttime paving work is scheduled Monday through Friday at 7:00 PM until 7:00 AM the following mornings.

Residents and businesses near the project may temporarily experience increased noise levels during construction. The noisiest process, pavement grinding, is to end by midnight.
